A Brief Note About the School

The DAV Group of Schools, Chennai, is an embodiment of Dayanand Anglo- Vedic Movement that began in 1886. It was inspired by Swami Dayanand Saraswati, the founder of Arya Samaj with the aim of building a knowledge-driven society based on Vedic Principles.



The seeds of the DAV Group of Schools were sown in Chennai, in the year 1970, by dedicated visionaries under the auspices of Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society (TNAES), with a vision to provide, affordable, value based, quality education. The schools believe in the Vedic Way of Life i.e. the Practice of Pancha Maha Yajna as prescribed in the Vedas.

The Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society, registered under the Societies Act is managing the DAV Group of Schools. The Society runs 5 full-fledged Senior Secondary Schools affiliated to the CBSE, New Delhi and one Higher Secondary School at Gill Nagar, recognized by the Tamil Nadu State Board in Chennai. The Society governs two Government aided schools and one Vocational Training Centre in Chennai. The DAV School at Puducherry was started in 2017 and is growing every year. The recent addition to the DAV family is the school at Pallikaranai, with a strength of about 2500 in the year of inception (2022). The Society also manages three schools for BHEL, one at Ranipet and two at Tiruchirappalli.

With 50-years of legacy and experience, the group of schools has continued to burgeon and impart highest levels of moral excellence, which stand as a testimony for all the perseverance by teachers and students alike. Upholding the standards set by the past academicians, the institution continues to provide high quality, affordable and value- based education that encourages a sense of team spirit, individual effort and accomplishments.

Keeping in line with the values and compassion of the visionaries who started the school, the Board of Management consistently handholds for various endeavours with the other schools, as academic associates. We have 11 Associate Schools with whom we have partnered for the betterment of teaching and learning as a community.

To inculcate in children a sense of gratitude, compassion and empathy, the Sushrusa programme was introduced. Students are given an opportunity to interact with, children with special needs, residents of homes for senior citizens and serve them with a sense of humility. They are also helped to visit and take care of animals at Animal Care homes, Goshalas, Farms and also experience the significance of dignity of labour.

The school organizes Career Counselling Programmes for students of classes VIII to XII. Eminent people from relevant industries and distinguished alumni are invited to address the students.

The programme is held online, every first and third Saturday, for both DAV and non DAV students. Students are encouraged to enroll for the program at no additional cost and benefit from the same. We encourage the parents also to attend the program to help their ward choose a career.

In tune with the present times, to help children, parents and teachers who have a medical need, assistance is provided by experienced medical professionals through project Prashasthi, a notable venture of the group.

Professional counselling is available for students and parents, who wish to avail the same, apart from the regular counselling services at school. Parents may contact the Headmistress/Principal for any such support.

In continuance of the pursuit of excellence in academics and to provide rootedness in our culture, the group has ventured into publishing textbooks, that follow Indic-culture, are affordable, contemporary and value-based.

With the thought that good teachers make a good society, the Post Graduate Certificate in Education Programme was initiated and continues to serve the cause of Education. Teacher training along with practical exposure is the hall mark of the course.

DAV BHEL School, Ranipet

The school was started on 16 August, 1982 with a strength of 150 children under an agreement between the Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society, Chennai and the Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, Ranipet. Today it has a strength of 2421 with 110 staff members. It is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The school is primarily intended for the benefit of the children of BHEL employees. However due to persistent demand from the Non-BHEL residents of this area, the admission facility has been extended to their children subject to the availability of seats.

The school is situated in an ideal place with an impressive double storey building and spacious play grounds. Well equipped laboratories, a Library Cum Reading room, a Work Experience Workshop in Electronics and an Art Section have been provided. Computer Literacy Programme has been introduced for classes III to IX along with the facility for Computer Science study as an elective subject in the senior secondary level. Moral Instruction and Yoga Training form an integral part of the curriculum. All efforts are being made to develop among students an understanding and appreciation of the great and rich Vedic heritage and culture of our motherland in tune with the progressive trends in modern education. The school has always been maintaining an impressive record of cent percent pass in Board Examinations. All efforts are made to mould children to become successful citizens benefitting the nation.

SCHEME OF STUDIES

The school is coeducational and follows CBSE Curriculum.

Curriculum and Language Scheme:

For Classes I and II: English, Languages, Mathematics, Drawing, Painting, Craft, Value Education, Theatre, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

For Classes III to V: English, Languages, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Drawing, Painting, Craft, Value Education, Theatre, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

For Classes VI to VIII: English, Languages, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Drawing, Painting, Craft, Value Education, Life Skills, Theatre, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

For Classes IX and X: English, Hindi/Tamil/Sanskrit, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Drawing, Painting, Craft, Value Education, Life Skills, Theatre, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

For Classes XI and XII:

Language Scheme for Classes I to VIII:

For classes I to V Tamil and Hindi are taught to all students.

All students of classes VI to VIII learn Tamil. In addition, they also have the option of learning Hindi or Sanskrit.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Boys

Nursery:

Dark Grey shorts with elastic at the back and no belt loops and grey and white checked, half sleeved shirt and plain black socks, black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the shirt pocket.

Classes I to VII :

Dark grey shorts, grey and white checked, half sleeved shirt, school belt, black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the shirt pocket.

Classes VIII to XII :

Dark grey full pants with eight belt loops and leg bottom measuring 38 cm to 40 cm. Grey and white checked, half sleeved shirt and school belt. School monogram is to be stitched onto the shirt pocket.

Classes VI to XII (Footwear) :

Plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school).

Girls

Nursery:

Grey and white checked blouse, dark grey pinafore, grey bloomers, white ribbons (optional), plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the yoke above the pleats.

Classes I to V :

Grey and white checked blouse, dark grey pinafore, grey bloomers, white ribbons, plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the left sleeve.

Classes VI to XII :

Grey and white checked kameez, dark grey readymade jacket, dark grey salwar, white ribbons, plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the left sleeve.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION :

Physical education ensures physical and mental fitness of children. Moreover, to lead a disciplined life, students should take an interest in all the physical education activities of the school.

HOUSE SYSTEM :

The school has evolved a Four-House system for conducting competitions in various fields – sports, literary, cultural, etc. Competitions like debate, quiz, essay writing, short story writing, declamation, music, painting, dance etc. are conducted as part of House activities. The system provides opportunities for children to develop leadership qualities and to grow into full-fledged personalities. A healthy competitive spirit is nourished and the winning house is awarded a shield.

CLUBS :

The school has atleast 20 clubs organising various activities periodically. Students' talents are developed through club activities. Educational trips to historical, cultural and science centres are arranged.

NCC :

The school has an **NCC JD – JW** Air wing with an authorised strength of **100** cadets. Students (boys and girls) are enrolled as NCC cadets as per the NCC rules of course, subject to the availability of vacancies at the beginning of the academic year.

Rules and Regulations

1. Attendance on the last working day and the reopening day is compulsory. An extended holiday along with any vacation will not be condoned.
2. A pupil may avail leave only with prior permission except in unforeseen cases. In case of an eventuality, the pupil will have to ensure that the leave application reaches the office or the class teacher be informed on the first day of absence. Students will not be permitted to enter the class without a letter from the parent in this regard. Parents are requested not to apply for leave for their wards along with the holidays already declared by the school or extend the weekends.
3. All leave applications exceeding two days are to be addressed to the Principal by the pupil's parent/guardian, while application for short durations of two days or less are to be addressed to the class teacher or entered and also endorsed by the Class Teacher in the given format in the calendar.
4. Any pupil availing himself of sick leave shall be required to produce a medical certificate and a prescription signed by the doctor.
5. Late coming to school should be strictly avoided. Habitual late coming is punishable. Habitual late comers shall not be allowed to attend school. Reporting time to the school is between 8.50 a.m. and 9.00 a.m.
6. In case of unauthorized absence for 10 days or more the student's name would be removed from the rolls.
7. Pupils requiring leave during any part of the day, whatever be the reason, will have to obtain the Principal's permission in person, supported by a written request from the parent. Pupils will be permitted to go only with the parent / guardian.

8. Every pupil is required to have an attendance of not less than 85% of the working days in a school year, failing which the chances of promotion to the next class is doubtful.
9. Absenteeism on days preceding the Examinations or Periodic Tests shall be viewed seriously. The parents shall explain the reason to the Principal in person.
10. Parents should ensure that their ward(s) are present for all examinations.
11. Academic dishonesty (Adopting malpractice for academic work like record work, projects, class tests, examinations etc.) shall warrant severe punishment. Also, in very serious cases, at the discretion of the Principal, the candidate who is found guilty would be issued with the TC.
12. Physical Education is compulsory for all pupils up to Class XII. Students having less than 80% of attendance to PE classes, may not be considered for promotion.
13. Students shall be assigned suitable places in the class room by the class teachers and the students will have to adhere to the same.
14. Parents are requested to send packed lunch only through their wards. **The watchman has been strictly instructed not to collect the lunch bags or any other material from anyone, including parents for security reasons.**
15. Students are not permitted to carry non-vegetarian food to school.
16. Dispersal: The school gates will be opened to parents and escorts of students of LKG at 12.20 p.m. , UKG at 2.20 p.m. , classes I to V at 3.20 p.m., and for students of classes VI to XII at 4.00 p.m. Parents are requested to ensure that their ward(s) leave the school on time.
17. Dispersal of students of classes LKG to III is Nursery Gate and for classes IV to XII is Gate1.

18. Parents are to ensure that the students carry only the textbooks, notebooks and other materials required for the day. Students are discouraged from carrying anything that is not required for the day.
19. Students must strictly adhere to the school norms for proper turn out, which include belt, clean shoes & socks, clean & short nails and hair trimmed. Any default will lead to strict disciplinary action.
20. Students are expected to cooperate in keeping the premises of the school neat and tidy and therefore refrain from scribbling on the walls and littering. Any objectionable practice like damaging the furniture, dirtying the floor or spitting in corners shall be viewed very seriously.
21. Students shall greet one another and their teachers with the traditional "Namaste" and their behaviour towards elders shall be marked with respect and obedience.
22. On a teacher entering the classroom the students shall rise and remain standing till they are advised to sit by the teacher. At the end of the class, when the teacher leaves, the students shall rise again, express gratitude and resume their seats quickly. The classes will commence and end with a brief silent prayer.
23. The class leaders, deputy leaders and all students shall willingly extend their cooperation with obedience inside the classroom, at every school function inside and outside the premises.
24. The School Pupil Leader, the Assistant School Pupil Leader, the House Captains and the House Vice-Captains and other Council Members who constitute the School Prefect Council will help the authorities on matters of discipline and administration.
25. Students are expected to exhibit exemplary behaviour at all points in time inclusive of the short break, the long recess etc.
26. (a) Periodical Progress Reports shall be sent to parents or guardians to appraise them of the student's regularity, conduct and work at school.

(b) Any student who does not return the progress report within two days duly signed by the parent or guardian shall not be allowed to attend classes.

(C) Any student who tampers with the progress report or is found guilty of any other malpractice in this connection is liable to face severe disciplinary action.

(d) Any parent wishing to communicate to the school, based on the progress report sent to him is requested to make a separate communication to the school. Parents are advised not to enter any remark in the report card.

27. Whenever a call goes to the parent from the school in connection with the child's work or conduct at school, he/she will kindly make it a point to respond to it in the interest of the child.

28. Parents are expected to go through the School Diary of their ward everyday for any information sent by the school and acknowledge the messages sent by affixing their signature in the appropriate place. They are also requested to adopt the measures recommended by the school in the best interest of the child.

29. **No student is permitted to bring any money to school unless a written note is sent by the teacher.** Whenever money is sent, the parent should insist on an acknowledgement for the same from the teacher.

30. No student or group of students or members of Students' Association/ Clubs are permitted to collect any funds in cash or cheque from any internal or external source. The parents are advised to warn their children against any collection. Any violation of this rule will be strictly dealt with.

31. Parents are advised not to send their children for private tuition in any subject to coaching centres / teachers. The parents can seek the help of the Principal to enroll their child in the special classes being conducted in the school after or during the school hours.

32. It is also to be noted that as per the rules of the school our school teachers will not entertain private tuitions at home.

33. Students are not permitted to bring cell phones or other electronic gadgets to school as per Government Order and our school rules. Any violation in this regard will invoke strict disciplinary action against the student.

34. In case of emergency wherein the mobile needs to be sent by the parent, there should be a written request from the parent and the instrument should be deposited with the school office / class teacher as soon as the child comes to the school in the morning. If this procedure is not followed, the rule for non-compliance with regard to bringing electronic gadgets to school shall be applicable.

35. Random checking of bags shall be conducted on any day that the child is in school or in a school program. The bags can be checked for the following – (i) Mobile phones; (ii) Extra books not required by students as per timetable; (iii) Story books other than school library books; (iv) Any other unwanted material etc. In case of finding unwarranted material in the bag, suitable disciplinary action shall be initiated.

36. Application for Transfer Certificate, signed by both the parents must be handed over at the office by the parents in person.

37. This School Diary should be brought to school daily and entries regarding, Leave Record, Daily Work, Communication, Out Pass Record, and other details should be duly filled in as and when required.

38. The presence of parents for the Parent-Teacher Meeting is highly encouraged. Kindly follow the schedule given by the class teacher for the same. The parents are requested to contact the class/subject teachers on other days only through the Principal/Headmistress with prior appointment.
