D.A.V. GROUP OF SCHOOLS, CHENNAI – AN OVERVIEW

The Dayanand Anglo Vedic (DAV) movement was started by the Arya Samaj way back in 1886 in Lahore (currently part of Pakistan). Against the backdrop of a society riddled with superstitious practices and beliefs, the Arya Samaj emerged as an active advocate of education for all, irrespective of gender or caste. Thus, DAV, the first organized schooling system by Indians in that era, was established in memory of Swami Dayanand Saraswati, a versatile genius, social reformer, educationist, benefactor of humanity and harbinger of the national movement.

- 'D' Dayanand (Swami Dayanand Saraswati)
- 'A' Anglo (signifying contemporary education)
- 'V' Vedic (Shaastras based education with a blend of spirituality)

The far-sighted founders of DAV – Lala Lajpat Rai, Mahatma Hansraj, Pandit Gurudutt Vidyarthi and many others emphasized that education should be holistic with a judicious mix of Vedic (Paraa Vidya) & Contemporary subjects (Aparaa Vidya).

Arya Samaj in Chennai

Following the partition of India in 1947, many followers of Vedic dharma were among those forced to move from Pakistan to India with some settling down here in Chennai, where they recreated the DAV movement and founded the **Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society (TNAES) in 1970**.

Some of the key founders include Lala Indersain ji, Shri Satyadev ji, Shri Jaidev ji, Shri Balakrishna Joshi ji, Shri Ram Kalia ji, Shri Surendra Kumar ji, Shri VN Bajaj ji, Shri Balakishan Goenka ji, Shri DC Malhotra ji and Shri SD Nangia ji. They continue to inspire the next generations through a service-oriented Board and management who work on an honorary basis.

Education - Reach

Started with just 50 students under a banyan tree at Gopalapuram, the DAV Group of Schools today serves over **40,000 students across 10 Owned schools**, **6 Managed schools (3 Public & 3 Private) and 19 Academic Associates.**

Owned Schools - TNAES governs eight full-fledged schools located across Gopalapuram, Mogappair, Gill Nagar, Pallikaranai and Puducherry. Two Government-aided schools function out of Sowcarpet and Vyasarpadi.

Managed Schools (Public & Private) – TNAES partners with existing and new schools in both Public and Private sectors. Currently, the Society manages three schools for BHEL - one at Ranipet and two at Tiruchirappalli as well as three Private schools - DAV Sarada Eshwar Vidyalaya at Pozhichalur, DAV-SM Fomra School at Kelambakkam and DAV-The First School at Coimbatore.

Academic Associates - Drawing from the Institution's collective experience over the last 50 years, this service-oriented initiative is a unique advisory model to share the best practices with schools across the country that share a similar vision and are driven by the larger purpose of Nation-building.

The initiative aims to help improve the quality of education beyond metropolitan cities and currently works with 19 Academic Associates across Kallakurichi, Karur, Madurai, Mayiladuthurai, Melmaruvathur, Salem, Tirupur, Vellore, Kovilpatti, Mannargudi, Gingee, Karimangalam, Chittoor, Kanchipuram, Dharmapuri, Chidambaram, Namakkal, Srimushnam and Neyveli.

DAV - KEY ETHOS

With the aim of building an equitable, meritocratic, knowledge-driven society based on Vedic Principles, DAV Group of Schools, Chennai strives towards providing 'High quality, Value-based, Affordable Education' which is embedded in Spirituality & Service.

In-house faculty members intensively train, mentor and guide students with the help of recommended study materials. Foundational programs for Classes IX and X that focus on building strong fundamentals in core subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics are also available.

The recently formed **National Admissions Test (NAT)** department focuses on helping and handholding students to clear various entrance examinations like CLAT, CA, CUET, KVPY, IAPT, NTSE, NDA, NID and more, thus enabling them to gain admission to courses of their choice at eminent colleges and universities of excellence.

Career Guidance Programs are regularly conducted online to share real-time information and guidance by reputed alumni and successful professionals across various domains so that students are well-informed to make the right choice.

Holistic Learning

DAV Krida Kendram – The Sports Academy strives to help all stakeholders, including teachers and parents, gain a sense of sportsmanship and a passion for games through varied activities in Sports, Yoga and Self-defence. In addition to after-school training programs, workshops and inter-DAV competitions, the Academy also has hosted numerous events like State Level Basketball Championships and an International Chess Tournament amongst others.

A professional training program has also been introduced to help aspiring PE teachers gain competence.


DAV Kala Kendram - The Creative Arts Academy has been set up to encourage learning and participation in Performing, Visual and Literary Arts. The academy promotes both contemporary and traditional art forms and comprises of theory and practical classes, workshops, competitions and more.

VALUE-BASED (Spirituality & Service)

The institution rests on a strong foundation of Dharma (Spirituality) and students are encouraged to follow the Vedic way of life through the **Panch Maha Yajna – the 'Five Daily Duties'** that includes respecting and taking care of elders, guests, the environment and animals.

OTHER EDUCATIONAL INITIATIVES BY TNAES

Teacher Training - With "Acharya Devo Bhava" being one of its guiding principles, DAV Shikshanam was established in the year 2017 with its flagship Teacher Training program, 'Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE)'. Aspiring Teachers are given intensive job-oriented training along with practical exposure across DAV school branches.

Publishing - In pursuit of excellence in academics and to provide rootedness in our culture, this in-house division publishes textbooks that follow Indic-culture and are affordable, contemporary and value-based. Subject videos which will help students revise topics at their own pace is produced by the e-Shiksha Paathshaala Team. Prajya - a thoughtfully curated National News magazine for children is published every month.

DAV - SM Fomra Civil Services Scholarship Program - In keeping with our commitment towards Nation-building, the DAV-SM Fomra Civil Services Scholarship program was launched in 2022. Civil service aspirants across Tamil Nadu and Puducherry are shortlisted for this intensive residential program that provides mentorship and academic support by reputed faculty, free boarding facilities and performance-based stipends.

ARYA SAMAJ FOUNDATION (ASF) - VISION HEAL

With the farming methodology being chemical-free, cow-based and sustainable, the vegetables and fruits produced are both healthy and of high quality. DAV BHEL School, Ranipet

The school was started on 16 August, 1982 with a strength of 150 children under an agreement between the Tamil Nadu Arya Samaj Educational Society, Chennai and the Bharat Heavy Electricals Limited, Ranipet. Today it has a strength of 2320 with 109 staff members. It is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. The school is primarily intended for the benefit of the children of BHEL employees. However due to persistent demand from the Non-BHEL residents of this area, the admission facility has been extended to their children subject to the availability of seats.

The school is situated in an ideal place with an impressive double storey building and spacious play grounds. Well-equipped laboratories, a Library Cum Reading room, Digital Art, Stem Lab, Makers Space, Project Based Learning and an Art Section have been provided. Computer Literacy Programme has been introduced for classes III to IX along with the facility for Computer Science study as an Elective subject in the Senior Secondary level. Moral Instruction and Yoga Training form an integral part of the curriculum. All efforts are being made to develop among students an understanding and appreciation of the great and rich Vedic heritage and culture of our motherland in tune with the progressive trends in modern education. The school has always been maintaining an impressive record of cent percentpass in Board Examinations. All efforts are made to mould children to become successful citizens benefitting the Nation.

SCHEME OF STUDIES

The school is coeducational and follows CBSE Curriculum.

Curriculum and Language Scheme:

Classes I and II: English, Languages, Mathematics, Art, Craft, Value Education, Theatre, Music, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

Classes III to V: English, Languages, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Computer Literacy Programme, Art, Craft, Value Education, Theatre, Music, Yoga and Physical Education are compulsory.

Classes I to V:

Grey and white checked blouse, dark grey pinafore, grey bloomers, white ribbons, plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the left sleeve.

Classes VI to XII :

Grey and white checked kameez, dark grey readymade jacket, dark grey salwar, white ribbons, plain black socks and black shoes (model and brand as prescribed by the school). School monogram is to be stitched onto the left sleeve.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES INTER HOUSE COMPETITIONS:

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
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Rules and Regulations

1. Attendance on the last working day and the reopening day is compulsory. An extended holiday along with any vacation will not be condoned.

2. A pupil may avail leave only with prior permission except in unforeseen cases. In case of such an eventuality, the pupil will have to ensure that the leave application reaches the office or the Class Teacher be informed on the first day of absence. Students will not be permitted to enter the class without a letter from the parent in this regard. Parents are requested not to apply for leave for their wards along with the holidays already declared by the school or extend holiday during weekends.

3. All leave applications exceeding two days are to be addressed to the Principal by the pupil's parent/guardian, while application for short durations of two days or less has to be addressed to the Class Teacher and also endorsed by the Class Teacher in the calendar.

4. Any pupil availing sick leave shall be required to produce a medical certificate and a prescription signed by the doctor.

5. **Punctuality:** Please ensure that your child is always regular as well as punctual in reaching the school. Reporting late to school will be taken serious note of. Repetitive late coming will incur action. Students are advised to report to school only between 8.50 a.m. and 8.55 a.m. The school authorities are not responsible for the students who reach the school before the specified time.

6. In case of unauthorized absence for 10 days or more the student's name would be removed from the rolls.

7. Pupils requiring leave during any part of the day, whatever be the reason, will have to obtain the Principal's permission in person, supported by a written request from the parent. Pupils will be permitted to go only with the parent/guardian.

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8. Every pupil is required to have an attendance of not less than 85% of the working days in the academic year, failing which the chances of promotion to the next class is doubtful.

9. Absenteeism on days preceding the Examinations or Periodic Tests shall be viewed seriously. The parents shall explain the reason to the Principal in person.

10. Parents should ensure that their ward(s) are present for all Examinations.

11. Academic dishonesty (Adopting malpractice for academic work like record work, projects, class tests, Examinations etc.) shall warrant severe punishment. Also, in very serious cases, with the discretion of the Principal, the candidate who is found guilty would be issued with the TC.

12. Physical Education is compulsory for all pupils up to Class XII. Students having less than 80% of attendance to PE classes, may not be considered for promotion.

13. Students shall be assigned suitable places in the class room by the Class Teachers and the students will have to adhere to the same.

14. Parents are requested to send packed lunch only through their wards. The watchman has been strictly instructed not to collect the lunch bags or any other material from anyone, including parents for security reasons.

15. Students are not permitted to carry non-vegetarian food to school.

16. Dispersal: The school gates will be opened to parents and escorts of students of LKG at 12.20 p.m., - UKG at 2.20 p.m., classes I to V at 3.20 p.m., and for students of classes VI to XII at 4.00 p.m. Parents are requested to ensure that their ward(s) leave the school on time.

17. Everyday dispersal of students of classes LKG to III is Nursery Gate and for classes IV to XII is Gate1. Due arrangements must be made to receive/pick the students as soon as the classes get over.

18. Parents are to ensure that the students carry only the textbooks, notebooks and other materials required for the day. Students are discouraged from carrying anything that is not required for the day.

19. Students must strictly adhere to the school norms for proper turn out, which include belt, clean shoes & socks, clean & short nails and hair trimmed. Any default will lead to strict disciplinary action.

20. Students are expected to cooperate in keeping the premises of the school neat and tidy and therefore refrain from scribbling on the walls and littering. Any objectionable practice like damaging the furniture, dirtying the floor or spitting shall be viewed very seriously.

21. Students shall greet one another and their teachers with the traditional "Namaste" and their behaviour towards elders shall be marked with respect and obedience.

22. On a teacher entering the classroom the students shall rise and remain standing till they are advised to sit by the teacher. By the end of the class, when the teacher leaves, the students shall rise again, express gratitude and resume their seats quickly. The classes will commence and end with a brief silent prayer.

23. The class leaders, deputy leaders and all students shall willingly extend their cooperation with obedience inside the classroom, at every school function inside and outside the premises.

24. The School Pupil Leader, the Assistant School Pupil Leader, the House Captains and the House Vice-Captains and other Council Members who constitute the School Prefect Council will help the authorities on matters of discipline and administration.

25. Students are expected to exhibit exemplary behaviour at all points in time inclusive of the short break, the long recess etc.

26. (a) Periodical Progress Reports shall be sent to parents or guardians to appraise them of the student's regularity, conduct and work at school.

(b) Any student who does not return the progress report within two days duly signed by the parent or guardian shall not be allowed to attend classes.

(C) Any student who tampers with the progress report or is found guilty of any other malpractice in this connection is liable to face severe disciplinary action.

(d) Any parent wishing to communicate to the school, based on the progress report sent to him is requested to make a separate communication to the school. Parents are advised not to enter any remark in the report card.

27. Whenever a call goes to the parent from the school in connection with the child's work or conduct at school, he/she will kindly make it a point to respond to it in the interest of the child.

28. Parents are expected to go through the School Diary of their ward everyday for any information sent by the school and acknowledge the messages sent by affixing their signature in the appropriate place. They are also requested to adopt the measures recommended by the school in the best interest of the child.

29. No student is permitted to bring any money to school unless a written note is sent by the teacher. Whenever money is sent, the parent should insist on an acknowledgement for the same from the teacher.

30. No student or group of students or members of Students' Association/ Clubs are permitted to collect any funds in cash or cheque from any internal or external source. The parents are advised to warn their children against any collection. Any violation of this rule will be strictly dealt with.

31. Parents are advised not to send their children for private tuition in any subject to coaching centres / teachers. The parents can seek the help of the Principal to enroll their child in the special classes being conducted in the school after or during the school hours.

32. It is also to be noted that as per the rules of the school our school Teachers will not entertain private tuitions at home.

33. Students are not permitted to bring cell phones or other electronic gadgets to school as per Government Order and our school rules. Any violation in this regard will invoke strict disciplinary action against the student.

34. In case of emergency wherein the mobile needs to be sent by the parent, there should be a written request from the parent and the instrument should be deposited with the school office / class teacher as soon as the child comes to the school in the morning. If this procedure is not followed, the rule for non-compliance with regard to bringing electronic gadgets to school shall be applicable.

35. Random checking of bags shall be conducted on any day that the child is in school or in a school program. The bags can be checked for the following – (i) Mobile phones; (ii) Extra books not required by students as per timetable; (iii) Story books other than school library books; (iv) Any other unwanted material etc. In case of finding unwarranted material in the bag, suitable disciplinary action shall be initiated.

36. Application for Transfer Certificate, signed by both the parents must be handed over to the office by the parents in person.

37. This School Diary should be brought to school daily and entries regarding, Leave Record, Daily Work, Communication, Out Pass Record, and other details should be duly filled in as and when required.

38. The presence of parents for the Parent-Teacher Meeting is highly encouraged. Kindly follow the schedule given by the class teacher for the same. The parents are requested to contact the class/subject teachers on other days only through the Principal/Headmistress with prior appointment.


